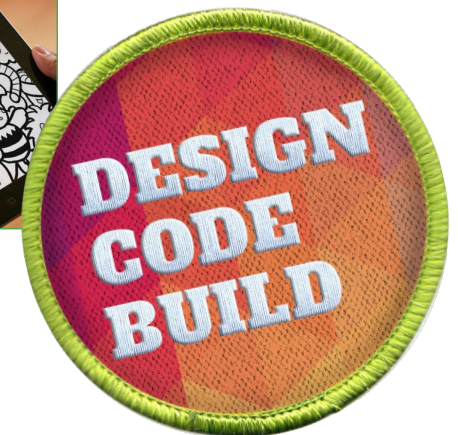
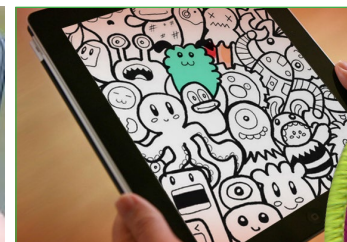
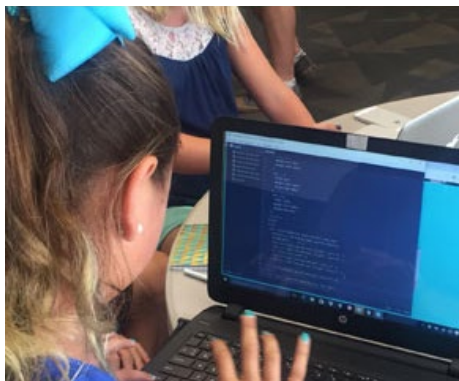

Pick-up: 4pm Friday afternoon at the Design Code Build classroom at the Student Services Center off Gilman and Eucalyptus Grove. Parents are invited to come as early as 3pm to view the girls' presentations of what they have made over the week.

About the Dorms:

The Muir Residence Halls are a short 5-minute walk from our classrooms on campus. They feature 5 or 6 bedrooms to a suite: one will be reserved for the RA, and of the remaining rooms there are 2 triples, and 1-2 singles. Each suite has a common lounge area, bathroom, and kitchenette. All linens are included.

About the Meal Plan:

Our RAs bring the campers to the dining halls for breakfast and for dinner, where there will be buffet or entree choices. Lunch will be a boxed lunch delivered to the classroom. There will be vegetarian options and you may specify allergies.

After-Hours & Sight-Seeing

After camp each day, the girls will want to unwind! They will get a little downtime back at the dorms, and afterwards we have great activities planned including a tour of the Salk Institute across the street, a visit to the Super Computer Center on campus, a Girl Scout BBQ with special Design Code Build guests who work in the game development industry, the sciences, and more.

About Our RAs:

Our RAs are female UCSD students with summer camp experience, Red Cross training and SDPD background clearance. They will be responsible for chaperoning the girls from the dorm to breakfast to the classroom in the mornings, then bringing them from the classroom to the dorms, dinner and evening activities. They will stay overnight in one of the rooms in the suite. If you have a parent interested in chaperoning instead and have a group of 5 or more staying, we can offer a great discounted rate - please contact us for details. We would still have an RA rep in the residence hall, just not in your immediate suite.



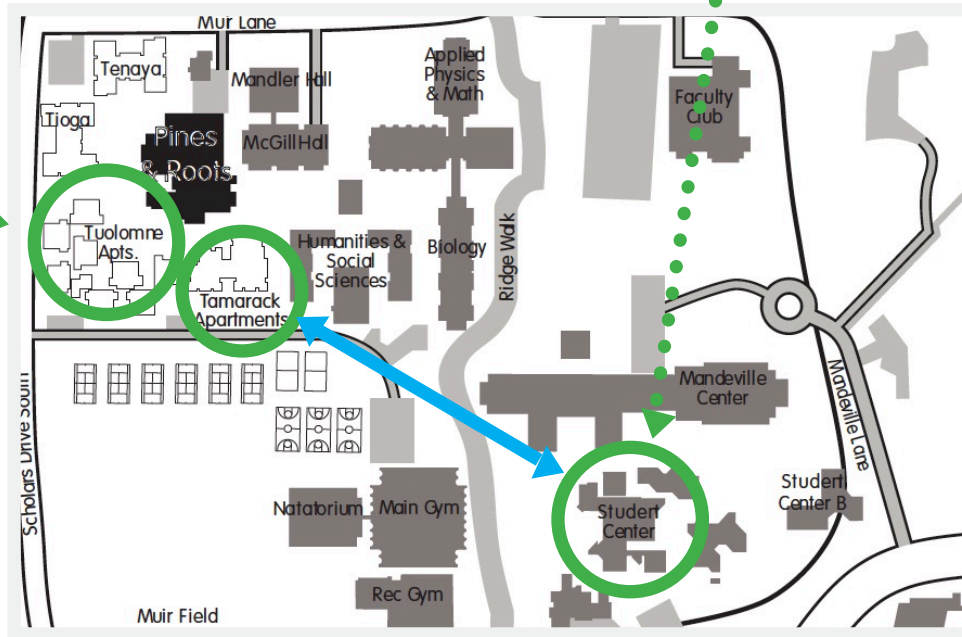

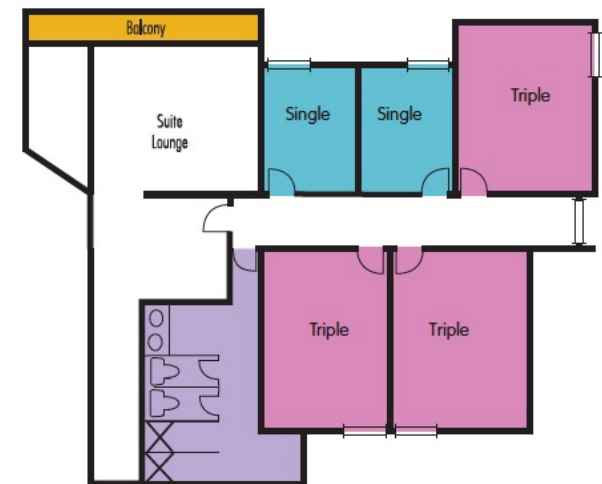
Design Code Build classrooms at UCSD
